Pinehurst School: Thirty Years (so far)

Pinehurst School's journey began in 1991 when Albany was full of fields and orchards. The first three classrooms arrived in time for the start of the school year, and the primary school grew quickly. College classes started just a few years later, and the school environment developed steadily, year after year, carefully managing the space, ensuring that we kept the green, open feel of a Kiwi school.


The Primary school has now expanded to twenty-two classrooms. Junior College houses 10 classrooms and music practice rooms. Our first College building, it set the template for light, bright spaces that you now find throughout the school. The Village, College 1, College 2, College 3 and College 4 followed over a period of 15 years, and of course we have our community spaces: the Gym, the Arena and our new Library.







Pinehurst Theatre and College 5



The time has now come to replace our 'Village' classrooms with a new building that will enable every student in the school to learn in modern classrooms, and to perform in our own theatre. We have so much musical and dramatic talent in our school that it is time for us to have our own space for our amazing young people. Our new block will have two purposes and two names: the classrooms will form 'College 5' and they will be connected to the 'Pinehurst Theatre'.









The Pinehurst Theatre will have 240 comfortable, permanent, raked seats, expandable to 440 for when the need arises. Designed with music, drama and dance in mind, it will have great acoustic performance, and flexible staging to ensure that we meet the needs of our students and teachers, today and in the future.

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Our new Theatre will be elegant but practical. High quality materials bring a modern sense of understated comfort; but at the same time, we have made sure that our Theatre will endure. The finish will be hard-wearing, and the theatre has been designed with flexibility in mind. The seats are being constructed with foldaway desks, so we will be able to use it as a lecture theatre as well as a performance space.


Our classrooms are to be built to the same standards, and following the same principles, as those in College 4. This means they will be bright and colourful, and a little larger than average. There will be space outside the classrooms to spill into if students and teachers want a little flexibility.

Our Theatre will also be equipped with the latest technology. We will install professional quality sound and lighting equipment that is also ideal for students' learning.

This project will start at the end of 2021 with a projected completion date of April 2023.









Pinehurst Theatre and College 5 will offer our students so much more than a space to perform.

- The seven classrooms are a replacement for the seven Village classrooms, which means that all of our children will now be learning in what we feel are perfect, permanent learning spaces.
- Pinehurst musical performances will be more regular, and more wide ranging. These can range from full orchestral performances and rehearsals, Gala Concerts, or small chamber events.
- Student groups will also be able to book the Theatre: we're looking forward to hearing our rock groups take the stage!
- Pinehurst productions in Primary and College will take place in our Theatre, giving us the chance to improve our rehearsal, tailor our spaces and our shows, and involve students in all aspects of the technical support as well as the performances.
- Our larger presentations and smaller prizegivings will also take place in our Theatre.
- Teachers will be able to book the space during the school day for class performances, lectures – bringing classes together on special occasions – or visiting speakers and events.
- Many assemblies will be able to take place in our Theatre too.
- Other schools and community groups will be able to book the Theatre at certain times of the year as well. The function space in the Lobby of the Theatre may also be a great space for outside groups to book.



The new Theatre will be a place where our children's imaginations can roam, and where our dedicated, talented staff can find inspiration.

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Pinehurst School has carefully managed its resources throughout its journey to becoming one of New Zealand's leading independent schools. We own all of our land and all of our buildings. 
